2010 service awards

Altschule nursing award goes to Arzumanyan

Nonna Arzumanyan, a mental health specialist at McLean for the past 14 years, is the winner of this year's Julia Altschule Award. She received the award, for providing exemplary and humane patient care, during McLean's Service Award Ceremony on May 12.

The primary mental health specialist in the hospital's Electroconvulsive Therapy (ECT) Service recovery lounge, Arzumanyan is responsible for monitoring and helping patients who are recovering from the outpatient procedure. "Nonna is kind, gentle and efficient as she interacts with patients in various states of alertness," said Paula Bolton, RN/NP, nurse director of the Psychiatric Neurotherapeutics Program, who nominated Arzumanyan for the award. "She is patient in her re-orientation of patients and is very

helpful in assessing post-ECT side effects. She is especially good," Bolton noted, "with our elderly patients and assists them with an unflinching demeanor."

According to Bolton, Arzumanyan goes out of her way to accommodate patient needs and has stayed late many times to monitor patients whose rides are delayed or whose family members need to pick them up later in the day."

Arzumanyan, who is also a community residence counselor, said winning the award makes her feel appreciated. "The fact that all of my co-workers were so excited for me made it even more special."

Father and daughter share common McLean bond

"Carmie is dependable, loyal and can be called on at any time of the day or night and will respond with a smile," said his boss Andrew Healy, director of Facilities. To D'Andrea, McLean is "like home—they treat me good."

Philip Levendusky, PhD, senior vice president for Business Development and Communications, called Dalton "hardworking, talented and creative." A former full-time employee, Dalton, a new mother to Max, age six and a half months, now works only 20 hours a week to care for her son.

She said she was "excited" to receive the award at the same time as her father. "It's funny, we both have our landmark anniversary dates at the same time," she noted. The ceremony marked a rare occasion for Dalton to see her father during working hours. "We don't see each other much at work since we work in different buildings, but we see each other a lot off campus." ♦

Historical Notes

National Nurses' Month

In its 86-year history, the McLean Asylum Training School of Nurses graduated 807 male nurses. The nursing school saw its first male class graduated in 1888, six years after its inception. Male nursing students spent 12 months of their three-year course working at affiliated schools of nursing, where they received practical experience in the nursing, medical, surgical and genitourinary diseases. They also garnered operating room experience.

LeRoy N. Craig, RN, a 1911 graduate of the McLean Nursing School, was the first superintendent of the Pennsylvania Hospital School of Nursing for Men, founded in 1914. He played an important role in national politics, obtaining commissions for male nurses in the United States Army Nurse Corps, beginning in 1955. Another nursing school graduate, Charles E. Ludwig, RN, Class of 1889, later became a member of the first Massachusetts Board of Registration in Nursing in 1910.
